*To the rest I say (I, not the Lord) that if any brother has a wife who is an unbeliever, and she consents to live with him, he **should not divorce her**. If any woman has a husband who is an unbeliever, and he consents to live with her, she **should not divorce him**.*

(1Cor 7:12,13)

FAQ

Q2 - I am a Christian, but my spouse is not. Should I divorce my unbelieving spouse and try to find a believer to marry?

A2 - No.

Wives, in the same way be submissive to your husbands so that, if any of them do not believe the word, they may be won over without words by the behavior of their wives, when they see the purity and reverence of your lives. (1Pet 3:1-2)

A Christian is free to remarry only if his/her unbelieving spouse **initiates** the divorce.

Q3 – Besides adultery and abandonment, is there another reason why a previously married person can remarry?

A3 – Yes. When the spouse is deceased.

*For a married woman is bound by law to her husband while he lives, but if her husband dies she is released from the law of marriage. Accordingly, she will be called an adulteress if she lives with another man while her husband is alive. **But if her husband dies, she is free from that law,** and if she marries another man she is not an adulteress. (Rom 7:2-3)*

*..... the wife should not separate from her husband (but if she does, she should remain unmarried or else **be reconciled** to her husband), and the husband should not divorce his wife. (1Cor 7:10-11)*

A5 - Divorce (and adultery) is a serious matter.

But God is gracious to forgive (1 John 1:9).

Confess your sin to your former spouse and ask forgiveness.

From henceforth, honor God's Word pertaining to marriage.

FAQ

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A6 - Think of all the ways we, as followers of Christ, commit spiritual adultery against God. But God does not forsake us. His heart is always to forgive us and to reconcile with us when we repent.

FAQ

Q6 - My spouse committed adultery. According to Matthew 5:32 I have grounds for divorce. Should I get a divorce because I can?

A6 - Think of all the ways we, as followers of Christ, commit spiritual adultery against God. But God does not forsake us. His heart is always to forgive us and to reconcile with us when we repent.

We can extend this same grace toward a spouse. Divorce is permitted, but not required.
