


Reasons Christians do not use apologetics:

1. Deny the role of faith


James 2:19

Reasons Christians do not use apologetics:

1. Christian apologetics answers non-Christians' questions and removes distractions from belief.

2. Christian apologetics, coupled with evangelism, points non-Christians to faith in Jesus.

E.g. Apostle Paul in Acts 17:22-33 Used reason and cultural examples of an altar in Athens and a Greek poem.
