The Word of God


The whole theme of the bible is Jesus from Genesis (3:15) to Malachi (3:1-5), from Matthew to Revelations

Our Meaning

John 10:10 – Jesus came to give us life and life more abundantly

Our Righteousness

Romans 8: 3-4 - For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do. By sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and for sin, he condemned sin in the flesh, in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us, who walk not according to the flesh but according to the spirit

1 Pet 3:18 – For Christ also died for sins once for all, the just for the unjust, so that He might bring us to God, having been put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit








Resurrection of Jesus – (Matt 28, Mark 16, Luk 24, John 20)






¹⁸ For the word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. ¹⁹ For it is written,

"I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart."

²⁰ Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world?²¹ For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, it pleased God through the folly of what we preach to save those who believe. ²² For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom,²³ but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and folly to Gentiles, ²⁴ but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. ²⁵ For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men. – 1 Cor 1:18-25

Roman Historians Tacitus and Josephus


Cornelius Tacitus – Roman senator and one of the best Roman historians; he despised the Christians

In the Annals he wrote:



Roman Historians Tacitus and Josephus

[N]either human effort nor the emperor's generosity nor the placating of the gods ended the scandalous belief that the fire had been ordered [by Nero]. Therefore, to put down the rumor, Nero substituted as culprits and punished in the most unusual ways those hated for their shameful acts ... whom the crowd called "Chrestians." The founder of this name, Christ [Christus in Latin], had been executed in the reign of Tiberius by the procurator Pontius Pilate ... Suppressed for a time, the deadly superstition erupted again not only in Judea, the origin of this evil, but also in the city [Rome], where all things horrible and shameful from everywhere come together and become popular.



Roman Historians Tacitus and Josephus

Flavius Josephus – Jewish priest who live in Rome in AD 66 wrote the *Testimonium Flavianum (now in Bibliothèque Nationale de France)*



Roman Historians Tacitus and Josephus

Around this time there lived Jesus, a wise man, if indeed one ought to call him a man. For he was one who did surprising deeds, and a teacher of such people as accept the truth gladly. He won over many Jews and many of the Greeks. He was the Messiah. When Pilate, upon hearing him accused by men of the highest standing among us, had condemned him to be crucified, those who in the first place came to love him did not give up their affection for him, for on the third day, he appeared to them restored to life. The prophets of God had prophesied this and countless other marvelous things about him. And the tribe of Christians, so called after him, have still to this day not died out.

Prophecies about Jesus

Who: "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace." Isaiah 9:6

What: "because you will not abandon me to the grave, nor will you let your Holy One see decay." Psalm 16:10 (fulfilled Acts 2:31)

Where: "But you, Bethlehem Ephrathah, though you are small among the clans of Judah, out of you will come for me one who will be ruler over Israel." Micah 5:2 (fulfilled Matthew 2:1-2)

How: "Therefore, the Lord Himself will give you a sign: The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son and will call him Immanuel." Isaiah 7:14 (fulfilled in Matthew 1:18)



Prophecies about Jesus

"Surely he took up our infirmities and carried our sorrows, yet we considered him stricken by God, smitten by him, and afflicted. But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed. We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed and afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; he was led like a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth."

He grew up before him like a tender shoot, and like a root out of dry ground. He had no beauty or majesty to attract us to him, nothing in his appearance that we should desire him. He was despised and rejected by men, a man of sorrows, and familiar with suffering. Like one from whom men hide their faces he was despised and we esteemed him not.

Jesus' Claims

He claimed to be able to forgive sin: In Luke Chapter 5. There is a great crowd around Jesus, so some men cut a hole in the roof of the house he was in and lowered a paralytic on a mat. "Friend, your sins are forgiven."

He claimed that no one could know God except through Him. "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:6)



Jesus' Claims

He claimed that he is the light of the world. "Again Jesus spoke to them, saying, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." Matthew 17:23

<u>He claimed to be the Messiah</u>. "The woman said to him, "I know that Messiah is coming (he who is called Christ). When he comes, he will tell us all things." Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am he." – John 4:25-26 (Samaritan Woman at the well)



Jesus' Claims

He claimed that he and the Father are one. "I and the Father are one" John 10:30

He claimed to be God. "Before Abraham was born 'I am'." John 8:58 ('I am' was the holy name for God in Hebrew, unutterable by any man. After Jesus said this, the people tried to stone him because he clearly claimed to be God.) see Exo 3:14



Jesus' Recorded Miracles

23 healings – (man with leprosy, paralyzed man, boy with a demon, crippled woman, official's son, man born blind)

9 displayed command over nature (feeding of the 5,000-4,000, calming the storm, walking on the water)

3 bringing the dead back to life (Jairus' daughter, widow's son, lazurus)



Why is the Resurrection so important?





"And if Christ has not been raised, our preaching is useless and so is your faith. More than that, we are then found to be false witnesses about God, for we have testified about God that he raised Christ from the dead. But he did not raise him if in fact the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised either. And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile; you are still in your sins." (I Cor. 15:12-19)





































No. Jesus didn't die.

The story goes:

- Survived 36 hours without food and medical care from flogging, crucifixion and spear on his side
- Rolled a 1-2 ton (~1800kg) stone at the mouth of the tomb from inside
- Overcome a guard of Roman soldiers
- Escape the tomb



No. Jesus is still in the tomb, everyone hallucinated

Counter Argument:

- Jesus appears to different group of people multiple times
- Jesus offered food to the disciples (Luke 24:43)
- Disciples touch and examine Jesus (Luke 24:38-39)
- Authorities would have produce the body of Christ to disproof the disciples



No. The disciples (mostly fisherman, tax collectors) have stole the body of Christ

Precaution for disciples stealing the body:

- A Roman guard (Matt 27:65,66) placed
 - A guard = 16 man team of 4 hour shift, 4 man per shift.
 - Roman solider are held by strict rules, if they failed their duty, they are punishable by death
- The stone at the tomb (Matt 27,59,60)
- Roman seal (Matt 27:66) Tampering with a Roman seal is punishable by death



Yes! Jesus has risen!





- Shared the gospel till their death (except John)
- Performed miracles by the power of the Holy Spirit

Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and count them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ – Phi 3:8



- Andrew (Peter's brother, also a fisherman) died on a cross at Patrae, in Achaia, a Grecian Colony.
- James (the elder son of Zebedee, brother of John) was beheaded at Jerusalem.
- James (one of Jesus' brothers, also called James the Less) was thrown from a pinnacle of the Temple, and then beaten to death with a club.
- John, the beloved disciple (elder son of Zebedee, brother of James, both James and John we also called "Sons of Thunder" or "Boanerges"), died of extreme old age in Ephesus.



- Judas (also called Iscariot), after betraying his Lord, hanged himself.
- Thaddeus (one of Jesus' brothers, also called Jude) was shot to death with arrows.
- Matthew (also called Levi, a tax collector) -- Matthew was crucified in Alexandria.
- Nathanael (also called Bartholomew) was flayed alive and beheaded in Albanapolis, Armenia.



- Peter (also called Simon or Cephas) was crucified, head downward, on a cross in Persia (now Iran) during the persecution of Nero.
- Philip was hanged against a pillar at Heropolis (Abyssinia).
- Thomas (also called Didymous and the doubter) was run through the body with a lance at Coromandel, in the east Indies.
- Simon the zealot, axed to death or crucified by the Romans in Lincolnshire
- Paul beheaded in Roman




- They all suffered rejection, persecution and torture
- But they never once renounced Christ
- People don't do that for a lie
