



## The Veil God Tore Apart

The Bible often presents profound and puzzling connections. One such connection is recorded in the Gospels:

"And Jesus uttered a loud cry and breathed his last. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two, from top to bottom." (Mark 15:37–38)

What does the tearing of an ornate linen cloth have to do with the death of our Lord Jesus Christ? What does it mean, and what does it symbolize?

## The Significance of the Temple Veil

To begin, the veil was an essential feature of the ancient Temple. Most fully described in the instructions for the Tabernacle, the veil was made from colored yarn and finely twisted linen. It was to be hung as a divider between the Holy Place and the Most Holy Place—the Holy of Holies (Exodus 26:33). No one could enter this innermost, sacred space except the High Priest, and even then, only once a year on the Day of Atonement (Leviticus 16), after completing specific purification rituals. The veil served as a clear barrier between sinful man and a holy God.

## A Symbol of Separation

For centuries, this veil—towering, beautiful, and solemn—stood as a foreboding reminder of mankind's restricted access to God.

Priestly mediation was always required.

Sacrifices of bulls and goats were necessary to atone for sin.

## **Everything Changed on Good Friday**

The Gospels record that at the moment of Jesus' death, the temple curtain was torn in two, from top to bottom (Matthew 27:51; Mark 15:38; Luke 23:45). This was no human act—such a deed would have been sacrilegious. Yet, the tear came from above, a clear sign of divine intervention. At Jesus' death, God Himself tore the veil.

### Jesus, the Final Sacrifice

Jesus' death marked the fulfilment and obsolescence of the Temple and the Old Testament sacrificial system. It was the culmination of His saving work. Jesus, our Great High Priest, had made the ultimate and

final sacrifice. Through His once-for-all offering, He secured complete forgiveness for our sins.

#### The Barrier Removed

So, what does the tearing of the veil have to do with the death of Christ?

In God's grand plan of redemption, the torn veil signified the removal of the barrier between God and man. It means that sinners now have direct access to God—not because God is any less holy, but because Jesus' sacrifice has satisfied the demands of justice in a way that the blood of bulls and goats never could.

## A New and Living Way

The separation has been removed. This is why the author of Hebrews declares with joy: "We have confidence to enter the holy places." How? "By the blood of Jesus, by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain, that is, through his

flesh" (Hebrews 10:19–20). Once, death awaited anyone who dared to enter unworthily. Now, the way is open. We may draw near with confident assurance.

## Living in the Light of the Torn Veil

As we remember the death and resurrection of our Lord, may we embrace the freedom revealed by the torn veil. Let us rejoice in the complete atonement for our sins and boldly approach God, knowing that Jesus has paved a new way for us—a way marked by hope, assurance, and direct access to God (Hebrews 6:19–20).




