Deuteronomy 6–26 as an Expansion of the Ten Commandments



1 No other gods before Me

Exclusive loyalty to Yahweh

- The Shema (6:4–5)
- Warnings against forgetting God (8:10–15)
- Not following other gods (7:1–8; 10:20)
- Remembering God's deliverance (8:1–10:22)
- Blessings for obedience (11:1–12)



2 No idols or images



3 Do not take the LORD's name in vain

Honor God's name and truth

- Faithful worship in times and offerings (14:22–26)
- Release debts in the sabbatical year (15:1–11)
- Treat slaves properly (15:12–18)
- Celebrate God's appointed feasts with joy (16:1–12)



4 Keep the Sabbath day holy



5 Honor your father and mother

Respect God-given authority

- Clashes of rebuke and justice/firmness
- Warfare laws and social order
- Obedience and respect for authority structures mirror parents



6 Do not murder
Protect and value human life

7 Do not commit adultery

Faithfulness in relationships

- Sexual morality (22:1–30)
- Marriage and divorce laws (24:1–5)
